Recent Prophecy and Prayer meeting

The summary of the meeting involves pictures, words, prayers and scripture:

- A bottle of spring water, a third full, shaken vigorously, the water settled very quickly, nothing had happened as a consequence. The action needed was to take the top off and let the water out. 'Measure for measure' is the play chosen for Riding Lights summer school. Matthew 7:2 'For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you.' A metre-wide concrete irrigation channel raised above the surrounding ground, stretching for miles, filled with flowing water. The water does not spill out; it has to be let out by opening sluice gates at the necessary points.

Both pictures are concerned with God providing His Spirit to bring blessing and growth in the Church but we have to be the ones who take the top off and who open the sluice gates.

- One member had the words of songs "To be in your presence" and "This is my desire". They had seen a picture at Sunday evening worship. It was of a dull dark grey plastic tube (like a drainpipe). When you look down the pipe, however, you can see patches of colour like in a stained glass window giving the look of a kaleidoscope.
- The way forward in New Earswick has rolled out remarkably: The Rector had been given a picture some days before of him walking up a set of stone/concrete steps that led up into cloud. The steps were attainable but the endpoint was not seen. The message was to take one step at a time in obedience to God and He would lead you into what He has prepared. As the Rector climbed the steps in obedience, others would follow.
- The use of 'Freedom in Christ' will be really big for some people. At a time of change the course is part of God's provision for us.
